Job Title: Construction Crew Foreman – Clinton County District
Department: Clinton County District Office
Reports to: Clinton County District Manager
Supervises: Lead Line Technicians, Line Technicians and Apprentice Line Technicians

Qualifications:

High School diploma or equivalent and must have completed SKRECC's Apprenticeship Program (or equivalent) and have at least 7-8 years of experience in the construction/maintenance of overhead and underground distribution lines. CDL License, CPR/First Aid training, Hot Line Experience and Pole Top Rescue training.

Job Requirements:

Responsible for the safety of the entire crew and assuring all proper safety equipment is used and all safety policies and procedures are followed. Above average communication skills (verbal and written). Capable of working independently with little or no supervision. Willingness to accept responsibility and accountability. Knowledge of line construction specifications, transformers, three phase banks, different voltage connections, voltage regulators, oil circuit reclosers, and capacitors. Must have working knowledge of all aspects of primary underground, pad-mount transformers and switching cabinets. Supervise all phases of construction, operations and maintenance of energized and de-energized electric lines. Is required to be in the "on-call" rotation and live within a 30 minute driving time (utilizing Google Maps to calculate the drive time) to the district office. Must be proficient with ropes, gins, blocks and knot tying. Must have a working knowledge of REA line construction specifications for electric facilities and must be able to construct jobs based on these specifications. Must be qualified to perform pole top rescue and CPR. Must be or become familiar with system area and have the ability to use maps. Basic computer skills are required. Responsible for assuring the crew members have access to and use all safety equipment. Operate all Cooperative equipment (including all vehicles) in a safe and efficient manner. Complete construction jobs while observing all safety policies and procedures. Participate in employee meetings and safety meetings keeping current on first aid procedures. Procure work orders and direct the crew on job location and materials needed for the job. Conducts job briefings before each job to coordinate and assure the safe completion of each job. Instruct Line Technician Apprentices on proper line construction. Assist with loading materials necessary for the job. Direct the crew in the installation and maintenance of 3 phase and single phase breakers. Maintain proper paperwork including work orders, service orders, material sheets, etc. Required to be familiar with the service area or have the ability to learn within a short period of time. Oversee the crew in the installation of primary underground and secondary services. Direct and assist in the installation of meters, line regulators, oil circuit reclosers and other equipment. Inspect lines for any hazardous conditions perceived to be harmful and/or dangerous and corrects the issue or follows up with District Manager. Coordinate member communication for permission to cross property for construction or maintenance. Supervise the crew in digging holes and framing/setting poles and anchors as required. Analyze work orders and coordinate material needed for daily work. Assure vehicles assigned to the crew are clean and in good working order. Assist in the restoration of services during outages. Communicate with other departments such as Staking Engineers, Right of Way, Dispatch, Service Center as well as developers, members and other utilities. Perform other duties as assigned.

Working conditions: A scheduled work week is 40 hours. Due to business necessity the work week may periodically exceed 40 hours with work on nights, weekends and holidays possible. Most work will be performed outdoors with some work indoors and possibly in extreme weather conditions.

Physical Requirements: Frequent lifting and moving materials up to 110 pounds. Frequent operation of large equipment.
Frequent standing, stooping, bending and walking. Frequent climbing up to 60 ft. Frequent use of eye/hand coordination.
Occasional operation of office machines.
