# South Kentucky RECC crews part of historic mutual aid deployment

he largest mutual aid deployment in Kentucky electric cooperative history was boosted by crews from South Kentucky RECC, who responded to the devastation caused by Hurricane Helene in late September and October.

At the height of the mutual aid response, more than 250 personnel from 19 Kentucky co-ops were working in Georgia, North Carolina and South Carolina. In addition, more than 100 Kentucky co-op contractors also responded to the calls for help.

South Kentucky RECC deployed two mutual aid crews to Haywood Electric Membership Corporation in Waynesville, North Carolina. The crews worked tirelessly alongside other cooperatives, responding to widespread power outages and extensive damage.

Veteran co-op crews said they had never witnessed this combination of tropical storm-force winds, rainfall and flooding.

The South Kentucky RECC crews were among nearly 10,000 co-op personnel from 24 states who descended upon the areas hardest hit by Helene.

Helene knocked out electric service to an estimated 1.25 million co-op members in the southeastern U.S, including 100,000 co-op consumer-members in Kentucky. Many of the crews who helped in other states responded first to mutual aid requests within Kentucky.

"In times of crisis, we're reminded that co-ops are more than just power providers. Our lineworkers brought hope and relief to those impacted by the storm, embodying our commitment to community," says South Kentucky RECC President and CEO Kevin Newton. "We are guided by cooperative principles, including 'Cooperation Among Cooperatives,' and state borders are no barrier when any member of our co-op family is in crisis."

# **GENERATOR SAFETY**FOR YOUR HOME

#### **Generator Do's and Don'ts**

**DO** operate a generator outdoors in an area with plenty of ventilation.

**DO** install carbon monoxide alarms inside the home to provide an early warning of this colorless, odorless gas that can kill you.

**DO** turn on the generator before plugging in appliances.

**DO NOT** plug a generator into the wall without installing a transfer switch to prevent backfeed.

**DO NOT** use a generator as a permanent solution.
